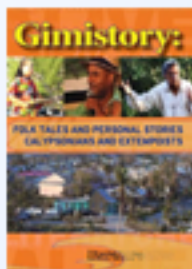
TITLE: GARDENING WITH OLIVE

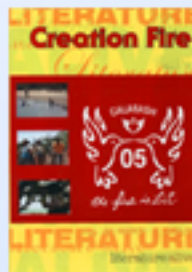
TITLE: WORD HAMMERS

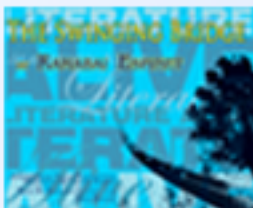
